Temporary COVID Guidelines PROTECT OTHERS

FACE MASKS

To begin the school year, DPS is requiring all students and adults to wear masks to prevent the spread of COVID-I9. Smith will follow this recommendation while meeting children where they are, developmentally, in learning this new life skill. Therefore, Smith teachers will work to support students' individual needs toward mastery.

- Children will be provided the choice to take their masks off when outdoors.
- Students will have space inside the classroom to take off masks if and when needed, apart from their classmates and at 6 feet distance.
- Adults will wear masks at all times they are with children and/or adults.
- In the event of a forgotten or soiled mask, Smith has extra masks on hand for children and/or adults to use if needed.



AND YOURSELF



Handwashing

All individuals will be asked to wash hands upon arrival, before eating, and as necessary. All classrooms follow hand washing guidance as prescribed by Colorado Rules and Regulations for Licensing Child Care Facilities (7.702.53AI) and the Colorado Rules and Regulations Governing the Health and Sanitation of Child Care Facilities (7.10.3).

All classrooms have a sink and the Smith facilities team checks the soap dispensers nightly. Teachers have set schedules with built-in transitions to provide opportunities for handwashing.





Cleaning & Sanitization

Cleaning and disinfecting will be executed as prescribed by the state health and sanitation guidelines (7.10.5 and 7.10.6) as well as when deemed necessary by the teacher or paraprofessional.

Toys and materials will be rotated when teachers observe that a child may have placed the item in his or her mouth or after coughing or sneezing.

All classrooms will adhere to the cleaning and disinfecting guidance outlined by the Colorado Rules and Regulations Governing the Health and Sanitation of Child Care Facilities (7.10.5 and 7.10.6).

PPE Use for Adults Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) & Hygiene Protocols

Masks: All adults and students are required to wear masks or face shields when on school grounds, with the exception of time for eating or other designated "mask breaks" that would take place outside, and except where doing so would inhibit the individual's health, in which case reasonable accommodations will be made to maintain safety and health. All persons will follow the CDC guidelines for facial coverings.

Gloves: At Smith and in DPS, teachers and other staff will not be asked to wear gloves. Cleaning and kitchen staff, as well as others such as health care providers, OT/PTs, etc. will wear gloves, based on health guidelines.

Face Shields: Smith is providing face shields to any staff member who requests to have and use one, even though the use of face shields is not required.

Staff Aprons or Smocks: In addition to face masks and shields, Smith has provided all EE staff (teachers and paras) with two sets of the smock, apron or scrub of their choice. This added layer of protection makes it easier for staff to remove and replace should it become dirty, soiled or unsanitary from the direct cough or sneeze of a child.



Visitors & Building Access
Per DPS guidelines, for the health of students and staff, visitors, including parents, are not allowed past the main entrance vestibule at Smith Elementary School. Should a family need to come to the school for any reason, they will ring the main buzzer and share their need, question or concern via buzzer call.

If possible, office staff will address the concern, question or need without ever allowing entrance to the vestibule. However, if support is not possible remotely, from the buzzer camera and microphohe, Ms. Maria our secretary will be able to help families from the office window in the vestibule only.

Please know that this remote support is in no way a reflection of lack of concern or unwillingness to connect, but rather, it is a health and safety precaution. Whenever possible, we would encourage families to seek office support via phohe call, text or Parent Square message. The main office bhone number is 720.424.4000.

Managing Traffic Flow

Daily Routines

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

Doors open to children at 7:20AM daily. Please remember to wear a mask when escorting your child to morning entry at the front door or an ECE drop off location!

K-5th Grade Morning Entry

K-5th graders will enter in through the main entrance off Jasmine Street at 7:20AM with a warm welcome and grab and go breakfast that will be located in the main lobby. As of now, health screenings and temperature checks are NOT required. When students enter the classroom, they will immediately wash their hands.

Smith staff will be at the ready to support in escorting children to class who need assistance. Families are welcomed to drop off children at the curb from their cars, or walk students up to the front doors.





ECE Morning Entry

ECE students will have separate morning entry locations at 7:20am (not the front doors), where families can choose to drop children at the curb from their cars (teachers will help kiddos get out of the car) OR walk children up to their teachers who will be waiting in the designated locations.

A quick sign in will be required each morning via ParentSquare for ECE students only, per ECE licensing requirements.

ECE children will be accompanied inside by their teacher or paraprofessional at 7:30am. When students enter the classroom, they will immediately wash their hands in preparation for breakfast in the classroom.

If you arrive to school for ECE drop off AFTER 7:30am the staff and children will already be inside. Please park and walk your child to Smith's main entrance on Jasmine Street for late morning entry. Buzz into the office, sign in your child, and an adult will gladly escort him or her to class.

Multiple Children (Including ECE) for Morning Drop Off?

Please remember that morning entry is from 7:20-7:30, so if you have an ECE child and older students, you can decide to stop at the front door first for K-5th, and then proceed to the ECE drop off location, or vice versa. Families are also welcomed to park and walk to both drop offs, as well.





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Dismissal Procedures

All students are dismissed from the building to the playground. Children in Ist-5th grades are permitted to walk independently to the bus, aftercare, a parent/sibling/designated adult who is waiting on campus, or home. Kindergart-eners require an adult or older sibling to accompany them after school. ECE students must be signed out by a designated adult over 16 years of age. All students are expected to leave school grounds at dismissal time, unless participating in a school-sponsored activity or after care.

ECE Dismissal

ECE classes will dismiss at 2:25 to the plauground.

 All children will wait with their teacher and class until someone arrives for pick up.

 'All ECE students must be signed out by a parent or designated adult before leaving the care of the teacher.

K-5th Grade Dismissal

• Students in grades K-5 will be dismissed from the east-facing playground doors (Kearney Street) at 2:30pm.

• Students meeting siblings will arrange to meet up outside on the playground, at another designated location outside, or at the dismissal door of the younger sibling who will be waiting with the teacher (kindergarten).

Students who attend an after-school program will meet a representative from their program outside each day. Those students will only re-enter the

building with their after-school program.

 Bus riders (Boys and Girls Club and DPS busses) will also be dismissed through the east-facing exterior doors. Busses will be located in the back of the building on Kearney Street.

Families LATE for pick up?!?

 Students not yet picked up are brought inside to the school lobby by the classroom teacher or paraprofessional at 2:40pm daily.

Inside the lobby, students will be socially distanced and wait by for an adult

to arrive for pick up.

After 2:40, parents'should come to the main entrance of the school and push the buzzer for late pick up.

• The secretary or office staff will take the child's name and may REQUIRE PARENTS TO SHOW ID before releasing the child.

Families who are habitually late for pick up will be required to meet with school leadership to create and commit to following a pick up plan. This plan includes criteria for timeliness and supports access to family resources, as well as the protocols school personnel will follow if the pick up plan is not adhered to with fidelity.

Wearing a school uniform is an expectation at Smith. Each day students will be complete a uniform check before they enter their classroom. The following protocol will be taken when a student does not comply with our uniform policy:

- 1st Offense: Students will be loaned a shirt or pants to be in uniform compliance. Students will return borrowed uniform at the end of the day.
- 2nd Offense: Parents/guardians will be contacted via a note home with their child. The school will loan a uniform to the student and he/she will be required to change clothes. Children are responsible for returning the uniform to the office at the end of the day.
- 3rd Offense and Thereafter: Parents/guardians will be contacted to have a
 family conference to discuss our uniform policy and provide support. The
 school will be required to change
 clothes. Children are responsible for returning the uniform to the office the
 end of the day.

Parent Square

Smith is dedicated to providing a quick and easy way to communicate with all families and students. ParentSquare is our school adopted communication tool that is used for all grade levels. Each family is encouraged to sign up to receive the most current, Smith-specific information. Teachers and parents are able to connect instantly through direct messages and teachers are able to send out whole classroom reminders, pictures, and more! Additionally, Smith Elementary will also send out whole school announcements, posts and tutorials to keep you informed, up to date, and prepared to support your child in his or her elementary school learning.



Please make sure that you are checking ParentSquare daily (or you have the Parent Square notifications turned on.)

Contacting Students and Teachers

In order to maximize instructional time and minimize disruptions, all telephones in classrooms will go to voicemail during student contact time. If it's an urgent matter, and you choose not to leave a message directly with the teacher on voicemail, the main office will happily deliver messages to teachers, if necessary. Finally, teachers will be outside at dismissal each day and are happy to connect with families to address questions and/or quick concerns.

We encourage families to utilize ParentSquare or email to communicate with teachers. Families can expect a return email within one business day.

Due to the busy nature of a school office at the end of the day, any change in pick up routines must be communicated to the office by 2:00 to guarantee the message gets to your child before the day ends. Unless there are extraordinary circumstances, teachers will return voicemail messages within one school business day.

Monthly Parent Principal Coffee Meetings & ELA PAC

Please join Ms. El Moudaffar and other school staff on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 6:00pm for our monthly coffee meetings! Following DPS guidance, these sessions will take place virtually via Zoom. We'll discuss a different topic each month, as well as provide time for open forum questions and answers.



Topics include:

Social Emotional Learning, Early Literacy, English Language Development, Math Instruction, School Performance and Goals, School Improvement Plans, Budget, Safety, Staffing and School Policies. Meeting details will be released on Parent Square each month in advance of the meeting.

Collaborative School Committee

The Collaborative School Committee (CSC) brings together Smith families, staff and community members to create and implement a plan to promote high academic achievement in our school. This committee meets on a regular basis throughout the school year and is an opportunity for stakeholders to have a voice in the school.

Members are elected to two-year terms and may be elected to no more than 3 successive terms. The constituent group elects new members to fill vacancies during the school term. CSC members will nominate and approve individuals to fill vacant business representative positions. CSC meeting agendas, minutes, and summary are made

Social Emotional Supports

A WORLD-RENOWNED LEARNING PROGRAM



Social and emotional learning (SEL) is a critical component of the educational experience that is proven to foster healthy relationships at home and school, lead to improvements in student behavior, reduce classroom disruption, and accelerate academic achievement.

Daily Social Emotional Lessons

Smith Elementary utilizes PATHS as our school wide social emotional curriculum, in addition to Personal Success Factors, and authentic texts leading to discussions about inclusivity and belonging. We provide daily, evidence-based social and emotional learning (SEL) lessons that cultivate a safe and positive learning environment. We build community, inclusivity, and interpersonal skills together each morning alongside classmates and adults.

Inclusivity & Belonging Topics of Discussion and Texts:

SEL texts and discussions focus on safety, belonging, community, empathy, race, diverse families, complex identities, respecting differences, bias, prejudice, stereotypes and advocacy. Families are encouraged to stop by the office for a book list and/or to borrow and read the books we share with children, as well as the accompanying discussion questions.

Friday Community Meetings

For 20 minutes each Friday morning, the whole school meets outside for community-building activities and routines, celebration, and FUN! We celebrate our people, our values, and our accomplishments. As the seasons change, who hope to be able to safely bring our community meetings inside to the gym!

Because visitors are not yet allowed to attend community meetings due to Covid restrictions, we will often live-stream portions of the meeting via Facebook, so be sure to like our page and tune in around 7:35am on Friday mornings!

This is a difficult time for many students and the transition back to school can be scary, overwhelming or bring about confusing emotions. Compounding a pandemic and current events may cause some children and/or their families to want additional social emotional supports.

 Emotional support and counseling is available by appointment for students who need assistance managing stress, anxiety, or would like I:I check-ins with support staff. Please email Ms. AJ Amanda_ romero@dpskl2.org if you want to request help for your child.

Food & Health

School Meals & Snacks

BREAKFAST

All Smith students are offered free breakfast daily.

K-5th grade breakfast will be served in a grab and go fashion. Students will grab their breakfast after entering the front door and then eat in the classroom.

 ECE students will be served breakfast in the classroom.



AM SNACK for ECE-Ist GRADE

- Due to our early start time, all ECE-lst grade students will be provided an AM snack
- Monthly snack schedules will include a daily fruit or vegetable plus another item
- Optionally, families can choose to send a healthy snack to school with their child to eat during AM snack time.

LUNCH

- K-5th students will eat with their grade level peers either in the cafeteria, gym, or outside. These three locations will allow us to have children maintain more space while unmasked and eating.
- ECE students will be served lunch in the classroom.
- Lunches will be served in individual and self-contained portions, rather than the more traditional lunch line and salad bar. There will not be family-style dining in classrooms, to reduce cross contamination.
- Adults and children will wash hands before and after mealtime.
- Furthermore, all tables and/or surfaces that may come into contact with food will be cleaned and sanitized, as per state licensing requirements prior to dining.

Children will not be masked while eating and therefore, will be spaced 6 feet apart or more during mealtimes. Every effort will be made to foster and encourage social interactions, even while at a distance, during meals.



Nursing/ Health Areas

Health Office Regulations: At Smith, we nave a health office with I cot per 400 students, a dedicated bathroom within 50ft for health office use only, a sink with running hot and cold water, easily cleanable surfaces, and an isolated area for sick students to be separated from well students.

Our designated additional areas for solating students, should there not be enough capacity in the health office, is in another office with a restroom, sink and cot.



Student Medication

Only prescribed medications will be given to a pupil at school. Over the čounter cough or cold medications, aspirin, etc. are not given, with or without parent permission, during the school day except with written physician order. All medication must be kept in the clinic and dispensed by either the school nurse or her designee. If a pupil MUST receive medication duriniq school hours, the parent or guardián must furnish the medicine in the prescription container. The containe'r must 'be plainly marked with the pupil's name, 'physĭcian's name, and name of the medicine, dosage, and time to be taken. The physician must fill out a school form detailing the name of the medicine, dosage, timing, and possible adverse reactions. The form, Request for Giving Medicine at School, must be filled out completely by the parent or guardian and the doctor.

Annual Health Screenings

Hearing and vision screening is done yearly for all ECE, Kindergarten, 1st, 2nd, and 5th grade students. You will be Notified in writing if there are any concerns about your child's visión or hearing. Please contact the school nurse if yo u would like to have your child's vision or hearing tested outside of the time when the schoolwide screening takes place. The school nurse also has resources available that can assist families financially with eye exams, glasses, and dental care.

General Smith Policies

Attendance Policies

Daily, on-time attendance is very important. Our goal for each student is that he or she is in attendance 97% of the school year or more. For this reason, after five days absent, families may be contacted by the school to remind you of the school goals and offer any support to maximize school attendance.

Tardies

The school day begins at 7:30am. Students arriving after 7:30am should report to the main office so they can be accounted for in the attendance system. Students arriving after 7:45am will be marked tardy.

Absence Notification Timeline

Safety is our number one priority at Smith Elementary School. In order to ensure that we are diligent and certain that your child is present and in our care, we have put the following timeline for absence notification into place:

7:30 School Begins

 7:30 - 7:45: Teachers submit attendance to the Infinite Campus System

• 8:00: Automatic Dialer (robocall)- If we have not received a phone call about your child's absence that morning, the automatic dialer goes out to alert you that your child is not at school. This is our way of double-checking that your child is safe. If you receive this phone call, please call us back to let us know that your child is in your care.





Early Dismissal


A student can only be released to the individuals identified in the Infinite Campus system through Parent Portal At any time, a legal guardian can update this information as circumstances change. Please contact the main office if you need assistance in changing contact information or identifying who can pick your student up from school.

Picking up a student before the end of the school day is very disruptive to his/her learning. Please LIMIT early pick up as much as possible. Minutes absent from school due to an early dismissal will be treated in the same fashion as minutes missed from school due to an excused tardy in a student's attendance record.

Smith Field Trips and Excursions

Classroom learning takes on a whole new meaning when put into the context of first-hand discovery and experiences shared with experts. Field trips are a way of taking the classroom into the community and are therefore regarded as an integral part of the educational experience. These trips also serve to heighten community awareness, involvement, appreciation, and commitment.

We do not allow siblings to accompany students on field trips. Field trips are meant as an opportunity for children to engage with peers, teachers and parent chaperones (once Covid protocols allow visitors as chaperones).



Homework

Because students engage in rigorous, authentic, learning activities at school for several hours each day, we want them to have the freedom to explore other interests and activities at home. For this reason, Smith students will not be assigned homework in ECE-5th grades, with rare exceptions.

· Teachers will gladly provide families with resources, materials and/or activi-

ties to reinforce learning and practice skills at home.

 Children will never be penalized for failing to engage in the practice activities provided by the teacher, even if the additional resources were requested by the parents. Without homework, there's one less obligation on families' plates each night and hopefully, this promotes earlier bedtimes for children-- our start time is EARLY!!

Legal Custody

The school must have a copy of a student's custody papers for our files when a divorce or separation occurs. Documents must be notarized or be from legal proceedings. It is the responsibility of families to notify the main office of any changes in custody.

Tabacco-Free Campus

Denver Public Schools is a tobacco free district. No tobacco products are allowed on school grounds, including E-Cigarettes.

Pets

For safety and health reasons, animals are not permitted on school grounds. This includes pets on a leash during arrival and dismissal times. Denver City Ordinances prohibit having dogs or other animals on the playground and at no time should an animal be off leash on campus. Please respect this ordinance even after school hours and on weekends. We recognize that some dogs are service animals and are exempted from the above policy.

What to Send to School

Winter/outdoor coats, hats, gloves, as needed Wear or bring tennis shoes for daily PE 2nd-5th grades only: Bring your fully charged device ECE & Kindergarten: Keep a clean set of clothes in your child's backpack



Electronics/Cellular Phones

The use of electronic devices is prolibited at school. Cell phones must have the tudent's name or ID# written or etched in it and must be turned off/silent once in the building. Phones will not be accessible to students during school hours, including in the building and outside at recess. A student may NOT use their cell phone inside the building during school hours. Once school is dismissed, students may use their cell phones outside the building.

If students are unable to demontrate responsible cell phone use, a behavor contract will be initiated. In case of an emergency, please contact the office at 20-424-4000 and we will be sure to relay the message to your student.



Miscellaneous Items

Miscellaneous items such as toys, trading cards, electronic games, etc. should NOT be brought to school. If these items are brought to school, they will be confiscated and a parent is required to pick the items up from the front office. If not picked up by winter break or the end of the school year, they will be donated. The school does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or stolen items.

Lost and Found

Every year the school lost and found contains many personal items of clothing that are never claimed. To avoid losing your valuable clothing, parents are asked to clearly label all personal belongings with the child's name so that lost items may be returned promptly. Please talk to your child to not bring valuable items such as jewelry, watches, electronic games, etc. to school. These items are easily misplaced and easily picked up.

Staff and students can take articles of clothing, water bottles, lunch pails ect. that remain unclaimed to the "Lost and Found" area located outside the cafeteria and hang them on the coat racks. Money and small objects may be taken to the main office with staff member permission. These items remain in the office until claimed.

If your child is missing a sweater, jacket, clothing, backpack or lunchbox, please encourage your child to check our "Los and Found." Each season, any items remain unclaimed. Remaining items will be donated twice a year to a local charity.

Schoolwide Celebrations & Parties



There are four dedicated days for class parties throughout the school year. While we are committed to celebrating these holidays with our students, celebrations will look different this year than they have in the past. More information to come as the celebration dates approach.

- Teachers will communicate with each family prior to the date about the details of the party.
- Parties will begin promptly at 1:30 PM
- All non-Smith children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Optional Birthday Treats!

As always, we are happy to celebrate birthdays with bur students but it will look a little different this year. If you wish to bring a birthday treat to share with classmates, they must be store bought and in their original packaging. No homemade birthday treats will be permitted. We will need to limit our birthday celebrations to treats this year and all other birthday items (balloons, stuffed animals, ect.) will not be permitted. Teachers will pass out birthday treats at the end of the school day in ECE-3rd and at the end of homeroom class in 4th/5th grades.



Safety & Weather Protocols

Evacuation Procedures

If it is unsafe for students, staff, and visitors to remain inside the building they will evacuate to designated evacuation locations on campus or off-site. The most common evacuation is a fire drill.

All students and staff will exit the school and go to designated locations. Everyone will remain outside until the "all clear" message is given. If students and staff need to leave school grounds, we will walk or go by bus to our designated off-site emergency evacuation locations students will be released to parents or guardians who are listed in Infinite Campus and have proper I.D.

There are two off-site emergency evacuation locations for Smith Elementary and parents will be notified via ParentSquare of these locations should an emergency evacuation occur.

Lockout Procedures

Threat is definitely away from the school. School administration secures the building and safely shelters all students, staff and visitors INSIDE the school building. A school will go on "Lockout" if a threat is in their neighborhood and does not endanger the occupants of the school. NO person is allowed to enter or leave the building. Additional precautions are taken inside the building.



Fire Drills

Fire drills are required by law and are important practice in the event that an actual emergency should occur. Students learn the evacuation path established for each room they occupy. All building occupants must move silently and in an orderly fashion to a specified area where they will remain until instructed to return to the building. Practice drills are conducted on a regular basis as required by Denver Public Schools.

In a serious emergency, school administrators must decide to Lockdown, Lockout, Evacuate or Shelter.

Shelter in Place

Severe weather is any weather condition that may cause injury to students and staff or damage to structures. Different types of weather call for different type of actions. Schools will go into shelter if the threat of severe weather is in the area. Examples of severe weather are:

High winds Thunder and lightning storms Hail Tornadoes

Smith leaders will monitor the National Weather Service announcements and will notify staff and students to move away from rooms on the perimeter and go to the designated Inside Safe Assembly Locations as necessary. School leaders will direct students and staff to take the protective kneeling position if indicated.

In the Event of a School Emergency

We understand that every parent's first reaction is to come immediately to the school site to make sure their child is safe. In order to increase the chances of all students remaining safe during an emergency, we ask the following of our parents:

DO ensure your ParentSquare phone number is up to date and be on the lookout for emergency alerts and/or posts from the school with updates.

DO check the DPS Website for updated information (http://www.dpskl2.org).

DO tune into local TV/radio stations for school news alerts.

· DO listen for information regarding reunification with your child.

 DO contact DPS Communications at 720.423.34I4 should you need to talk to someone

Refrain from going to your child's school. This will create traffic congestion

hampering the efforts of first responders.

Refrain from calling your child or your child's school. Excessive phone calls could jam the phone system and interfere with emergency communications. As soon as we are safely able to do so, communication will be sent to families via ParentSquare emergency alerts or posts with the most up to date information on the situation. Please ensure your ParentSquare phone number is up to date.

Winter Weather Policy

Arrival on Cold and Snowy Days- Arrival time remains at 7:20. Students can
enter the building and go straight to class as they would any day. Because
staff are not in the building to supervise children before 7:20am, we will allow
students inside the building until 7:20am, so please do not send your child early.

Weather Delay Schedule: When all DPS schools are on a 2-hour delayed start due to winter weather and road conditions, all schools will start two hours later than their normal start times, with bus routes adjusted accordingly. Smith's

2-hour delay start time is 9:30am.

 Winter Gear- Please dress your child in warm winter gear as we only call indoor recess when it is extremely cold. Otherwise, you can assume your child will be outside playing in the fresh air! They will need coats, gloves, hats, and any other outdoor winter clothing you see fit.

The decision to keep schools open or to close them during winter weather conditions is not a simple one, but it is made by DPS leaders (not individual school leaders) with one overriding factor in mind: the well-being of our students, their families and staff. It is a good idea to decide in advance how to best keep up with the changes, what childcare arrangements are needed, and how to adjust if schools are closed due to inclement weather.

School Closure Communication

• If the decision is made to close school, the DPS Communications Office will immediately notify local television and radio stations, which will broadcast regular announcements of school closures or delays. Information is also available at DenverChannel.com, 9News. com, KDVR.com and denver.cbslocal.com. Notifications in Spanish will be made on radio newscasts on II50 AM, I280 AM and I090 AM.



Smith will post any and all closure updates to ParentSquare and also accompany the posts by emergency alerts through ParentSquare.
